

River Wall Improvement at Thames and Palace Wharves

The Environment Agency plans to carry out flood defence repair works at Thames and Palace wharves. Thames and Palace wharves are two sections of flood defence wall protecting parts of the Hammersmith and Fulham area from flooding.

If these walls were to fail more than 10,000 properties would be at risk of flooding. The works will improve the condition of the walls and increase the level of flood protection.



In May 2009 we sent residents and businesses a newsletter to provide them with information about our role in flood risk management and the forthcoming improvement works. We have written this newsletter to provide you with updated information about the works and to invite you to a public drop-in session

Public drop-in session

You are invited to a drop-in session where members of our project team will be available to answer your questions. Drawings of the works will be on display.

Start date

We are planning to start the works in early January 2010. They are programmed to take approximately eight months to complete.

Working hours

We have now agreed the normal site working hours with the London Borough of Hammersmith and Fulham. We will carry out the work between 8am and 6pm, Monday to Saturday.

Traffic and parking

During the works, we will use the private car park adjacent to Thames Wharf for access and as a site compound. A smaller compound site will also be used behind Crabtree Tavern. During the works, there will be no access to the rear of Crabtree Tavern for vehicles and pedestrians.

Footpath closures

We need to close the river walk at Thames wharf during the works.

To ensure there is room for access and storage for the works at Palace wharf, we will also need to divert a section of the footpath next to Crabtree wharf.

A plan showing the location of the closures and the temporary diversions is shown below.

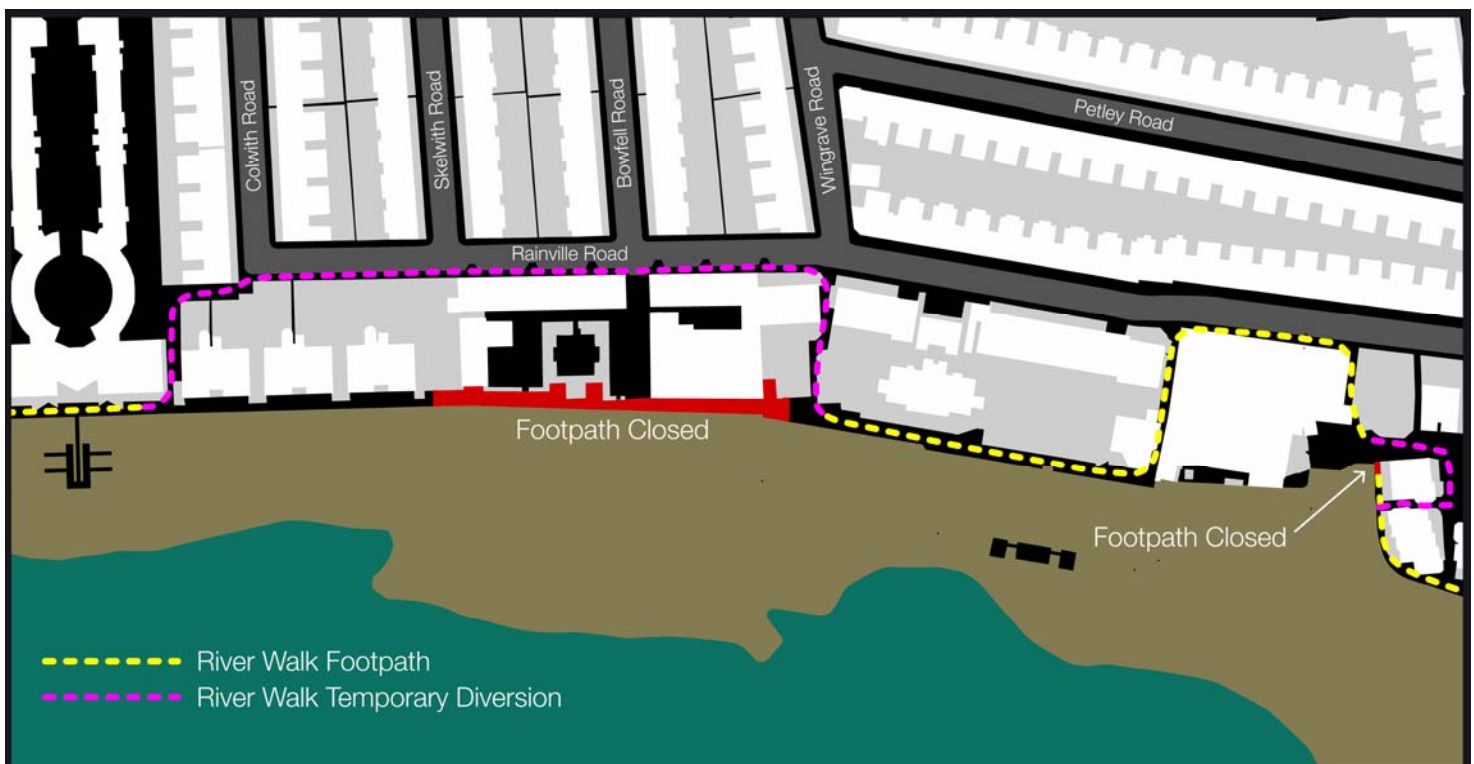
